Theme 1: How domestic U.S. law enforcement and homeland security is impacted by emerging international change and its insurgency, criminal, and other associated societal ills; especially as affected countries *successfully* develop and “globalize”

Theme 2: Understanding FUTURE domestic security issues AS HOLISTICALLY FORECASTABLE PARTS OF emerging international trends and patterns of change

- **Focus 1:** Latin American development and links with Middle Eastern and other frequent critics of the USA: consequences for U.S. security and law enforcement
- **Focus 2:** India and China - rapidly growing insurgency, societal stresses, and internal instability as a normal part of their development, and how that is moving offshore
- **Focus 3:** Mexico - Beginning in 1993, Dr. Werther forecast rising internal unrest post-NAFTA and consistently has said this shows no sign of stabilizing: Looking forward as a holistic assessment case

BIO: Dr. Guntram F. A. Werther is an internationally known author and an Executive in Residence at Thunderbird – The School of Global Management, Professor at Western International University, and a consultant on global change/emerging futures to the world's largest companies: Exxon-Mobil, Alcatel-Lucent & Moeller-Maersk (Fall 2010).

Guntram has consulted at the mid to senior executive levels of multiple other Fortune 100 firms and major governments for decades, and has developed cutting edge holistically integrative, multi-disciplinary, and cross-cultural training and assessment programs.

In 2007, Guntram won the Office of the Director of National Intelligence's Proteus International Futures forecasting competition, in 2008 his holistic work was featured by ODNI's *Center for Academic Excellence*, and in 2009 the Proteus Executive Director termed Dr. Werther's holistic assessment work as “unequaled.”
